



The question asked how important are the following in ensuring the character of the Parish. The results show that:




Litter, is it a problem in the Parish?



Section A Countryside Issues/Litter/Appearance of the Parish/Fracking

Reasons given In favour Fracking

Stop depending on imported fuel, future generations need fuel, economic benefits, need to move with the times, reduce energy bills.

Not in favour of Fracking

Pollution both light and noise, environmental damage, house prices, roads, water contamination, climate change, sustainable options wind and other renewables, safety, long term effects, property damage, disruption, disrupt business

(crematorium), multiple well heads – industrialisation, negative effect on agriculture/tourism, traffic increase, it is dangerous, the vibration could destabilise and fracture the underlying chalk, unhealthy, bad for environment/wildlife, Shale gas development may transform a previously pristine, quiet natural region, bringing increased industrialisation (DEFRA Doc page 16 Shale gas rural economy impacts).

Other comments

Not sufficient long term information available.

ACTION

If a planning application is made to the Parish Council, everyone can put their views forward online at the East Riding of Yorkshire Council website, in writing to the Parish Clerk or in person at the Parish Council meeting.

Other environmental issues in the Parish people listed were:

- Noise
- Lampers
- Larson traps
- Poor drainage Main St/ Church Lane
- Ash die back remove effected trees
- Loss of roadside habitat due to salt on the roads
- Poor road surfaces

ACTION

The Parish Council is working with East Riding of Yorkshire Council on repairing roads. Flooding and pot holes need to be reported through the East Riding of Yorkshire Council website by doing so this also adds 'points' which can raise our Parish up a priority list.

Cut hedges/verges – keep area tidy and safety re: clear vision on corners/bends in roads.

ACTION

The Parish Council has pursued this issue with East Riding of Yorkshire Council and consequently the flat areas of verges are to be cut on a three-weekly cycle.

Noise from neighbours: i.e. vehicle repairs during weekends, Sundays, Bank holidays

NB Help and advice on excessive noise can be obtained from ERYC through their web site or via telephone. There is an anonymous online reporting form that can be completed and action will be taken.



Section B Housing in the Parish

When asked should the number of houses in the Parish increase over the next ten years there was a total of 92 responses.

- 36 (39%) people said stay the same
- 28 (30%) Increase by 5 10
- 18 (20%) Increase by 10 15
- 10 (11%) Increase by more than 15 houses.





For those who thought housing in the Parish should increase.

The following are the type of additional houses they thought should be developed.

Top three

- 1. Private
- 2. Change of use of existing buildings/facilities
- 3. Shared ownership/ starter homes

Comments and concerns regarding further house building are:

- Help the young stay.
- Enable younger residents to come
- Bring people and business to the village
- Starter homes/ affordable houses-for next generation
- Increase population
- Increase chances of amenities succeeding Shop, Pub

- Public transport
- No housing estates (building line)
- Stay the same/ no more housing
- Aging population, no facilities mistake to encourage too many young families
 - Without expansion Thwing will wither and die. Present population cannot support pub/shop etc

ACTION

Thwing & Octon Parish is currently classed as unsustainable, due to lack/loss of services and amenities, and no further housing may be developed. The reopening of the pub with a community hall will give the parish the necessary services to once more achieve sustainability, and allow the parish to grow. Please give your support. To further help with sustainability the Parish Council are to explore the production of a Neighbourhood Plan.

31 people have had cause to call out the emergency services to an incident in the Parish. All stated the experience as satisfactory.

Section F Traffic/ Road safety/ Parking

Is speeding traffic in the Parish a problem?

- 61 people said Yes
- 26 No



The main areas of concern are: - B1253 High Street, B1249 Seamer Rd, Main St Thwing.

Although some returns did specify times when speeding is worse, overwhelmingly 'anytime' was the box ticked. All types of vehicles were identified as offenders of speeding, additionally agricultural/tractors were added to the list.

The following suggestions and comments were given:

- Speed humps/bumps CCTV
- Slow down signs (light up) and children playing
- Lower speed limit and enforce (fine)
- High St, 50mph/ speed cameras/ traps Chicanes/ bollards
- Police presence/warnings/ speed monitoring Gradually reduce speed signs 40,30,20
- Educate and shame

- Remove bend top of Octon
- 50mph on Old Bridlington Road Issue crossroads, vehicles pulling out
- Issue country lanes, speeding
- Move 30mph signs back from houses to give drivers time to slow down
- NB one person stated they clear the grate (on B1235 on the bends top of Octon) when it rains to prevent flooding and reduce the potential of an accident.

ACTION

All the above information has been passed to the PCSO responsible for the Parish. The Parish Council need to liaise with East Riding of Yorkshire Council about improved signage.

The Parish Council would like to thank the resident who has been clearing the drain, and we will draw the matter to the attention of East Riding of Yorkshire Council.

NB Blocked drains need to be reported to East Riding of Yorkshire Council via their website

Section F Traffic/ Road safety/ Parking

In answer to the question: As a pedestrian, cyclist or horse rider, **do you feel safe on the roads** of the parish?

- 68 people said they do feel safe
- 16 do not.



Suggestions to improve this situation include:

- Signs warning about horse riders
- Too many cars parked on Main St
- Inconsiderate parking and speeding
- Road surfaces bad for bikes/ walking, slippery and not wide enough
- Speed cameras
- More pavements

ACTION

This information will be passed to the PCSO and the Parish Council will liaise with East Riding of Yorkshire Council about road surfaces and signage.

Is there enough parking in the village

- 16 people found parking insufficient
- 44 sufficient at most times
- 26 sufficient all the time

Parking being insufficient lies with the following:- top three identified.

- 1. Residents,
- 2. caravan/ mobile homes
- 3. visitors to residents

Suggestions to resolve the issue of parking are:

- Paid spaces Pub/ Community Centre
- New houses must have off Rd parking
- Central point, sign posted for visitors (Octon/ Thwing Rd)
- Layby near council houses, Octon

- Beyond end cottage, Main St, grass verge.
- Double yellow lines in areas
- Space roadside adjacent to council houses
 Main St
- Widen roads

In response to the question: Do you feel that passing places on country lanes are needed?

- 84 people said yes
- 12 do not feel they are needed
- 1 person stated "they are there, just not maintained"

Yes 84 No 12

Of those who said Yes, all reasons were identified. These are to reduce damage - to grass verges, vehicles from overhanging hedges, vehicles from soakaways and reduce risk to pedestrians. Other reasons included, to prevent vehicles damaging each other, improve road safety, farm equipment size and farm tractors destroying grass verges.

Pass the above information to the Parish Council Transport Champion (Councillor David Mc Dermott). Contact interested people via the Benefice news, website and notice boards to come together to organise both a volunteer car scheme and Dial-a-Ride driver resident training.

When asked if extra space in the parish should be allocated to outside sporting and recreation activities:

• 33 people said Yes

• 30 No






17 people have used the Church rooms for a private function 67 have not.

The Pub


If the pub could be restored and enhanced with additional services such as a community hall. 63 people considered the community would use it, 18 did not think the community would use it. 1 thought maybe and a comment "not viable, use church more".



Of the facilities which are felt to be most beneficial, should the pub/ community space be provided, the following list shows the three most popular.

- 1. Restaurant and Community Space equal first
- 2. Shop facility second
- 3. Cafe and Post office equal third.
